
The Guildhall in Leicester, England, is a timber framed building, with the earliest part dating from c. 1390. The Guildhall once acted as the town hall for the city until the current one was commissioned in 1876. It is located in the old walled city, on a street now known as Guildhall Lane.



Leicester Cathedral

The Cathedral Church of Saint Martin, Leicester, commonly known as Leicester Cathedral, is a Church of England cathedral in Leicester, England, and the seat of the Bishop of Leicester.

The remains of [King Richard III](#) were reburied in the cathedral in 2015 after [being discovered](#) nearby in the foundations of the lost [Greyfriars](#) chapel, 530 years after his death.¹
